ICPSD Youth Community Development Program Updates

COVID called for programmatic pivots and thinking outside the box. The ICPSD Youth Community Development Program is usually an integral part of the Experiential Learning trips we host for American university and high school groups. We were saddened to not be able to provide immersive experiences in Togolese culture in country this year, but are excited to share the alternative approach we collaborated on with our partners at the University of Idaho. Introducing: Global Connections. Taking a fully digital approach, a portion of the ICPSD youth were able to share Togolese culture with University of Idaho students and vice versa. Over a 5 week period, videos were exchanged about various topics - including making and eating food from the respective countries. The final exchange was via a live Zoom interaction between the two groups.



A staple of Togolese cuisine and culture is fufu. This dish is made from boiled yams that are pounded into a dough and served with a variety of stews, sauces and side dishes. The students of the ICPSD Youth Community Development Program put together this video to share the process of making fufu. We hope you can enjoy fufu with us one day. Bon appetit!

In order to do a live meeting with the University of Idaho students, we sent a group of our older students on a day trip to Lomé. For the first part of the day they enjoyed a driving tour of the city and visit to see the beach. Due to COVID restrictions, they were unable to visit the market and <u>Palais de Lomé</u> - Togo's first (opened in 2019) major contemporary art and culture centre housed in colonial-era palace - as originally planned.
